CATHOLIC CHARITIES WORKING TO IMPROVE PHONE SERVICE FOR DISASTER RELIEF ASSISTANCE FOR IMMIGRANTS (DRAI)

SAN FRANCISCO, CA, May 19, 2020 – Catholic Charities of the East Bay, San Francisco, and Santa Clara are working in partnership to improve their phone service for applicants of the Disaster Relief Assistance for Immigrants (DRAI), a program of the State of California providing one-time financial assistance to undocumented immigrants affected by the COVID-19 pandemic throughout the state.

In response to the challenges undocumented immigrants are experiencing trying to get through the phone line to apply for the DRAI, the partners have secured a **new phone number**, **415-324-1011**, **effective immediately**.

In a joint statement, **Gregory Kepferle**, Chief Executive Officer, <u>Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County</u>, **Jilma Meneses**, Chief Executive Officer, <u>Catholic Charities San Francisco</u>, and **Margaret Peterson**, Chief Executive Officer, <u>Catholic Charities East Bay</u> have said, "We understand the challenges, concerns, and frustrations immigrant community members are experiencing as a result of COVID-19. As we are every day, we are with you during this pandemic and working hard through the State's DRAI project to provide you with vital assistance. We are committed to helping as many of you as possible through the next six weeks and ask for patience as we work to address the high demand."
